

## Reliance of MD's WIP Strategy on 2010 Trust Fund

Maryland's final Water Implementation Plan identifies the Chesapeake Bay 2010 Trust Fund at least 21 times as the source of funding to carry out specific measures necessary to achieve the promised pollution reductions. Because the Trust Fund is combined each time with other sources of funding, the total dollar amount of these commitments is unknown. [Download Maryland's WIP here](#).
